Tangible cultural heritage includes physical artifacts and structures such as monuments, buildings, and artworks. A notable example of tangible heritage is the Great Wall of China. Spanning over 13.000 miles, it exemplifies ancient engineering ability and functions as a symbol of cultural identity and historical significance.

Intangible cultural heritage refers to oral traditions, performing arts, local knowledge, and traditional skills recognized by communities as part of their cultural heritage. The UNESCO emphasizes that safeguarding intangible heritage means transferring it to future generations.

The preservation of both tangible and intangible cultural heritage is vital for supporting cultural diversity and identity. For example, the restoration of the Acropolis in Greece has been a significant effort to preserve ancient architecture and archaeological sites. Besides, through international recognition and dedicated efforts, communities can protect and promote their cultural heritage.

Foreign languages were introduced formally within the primary school curriculum in England in 2014 for the first time. All children from age 7 to 11 are now expected to study one foreign language for one hour per week. It can be any modern or ancient foreign language.

There are two main reasons behind the introduction of foreign languages in primary classrooms. The first is the belief that children learn foreign languages more quickly and more proficiently. After all, we learn our mother tongue effortlessly as young children, so the logic is that if you teach children early enough the same will happen with foreign languages. The second is that in an increasingly globalized world it is important to awaken their interests in other people and cultures.

To conclude, teaching foreign languages in primary can bring good results, but its goals need to be clear and realistic taking into account what research has shown about how children learn and the context in which schools and teachers have to operate.
